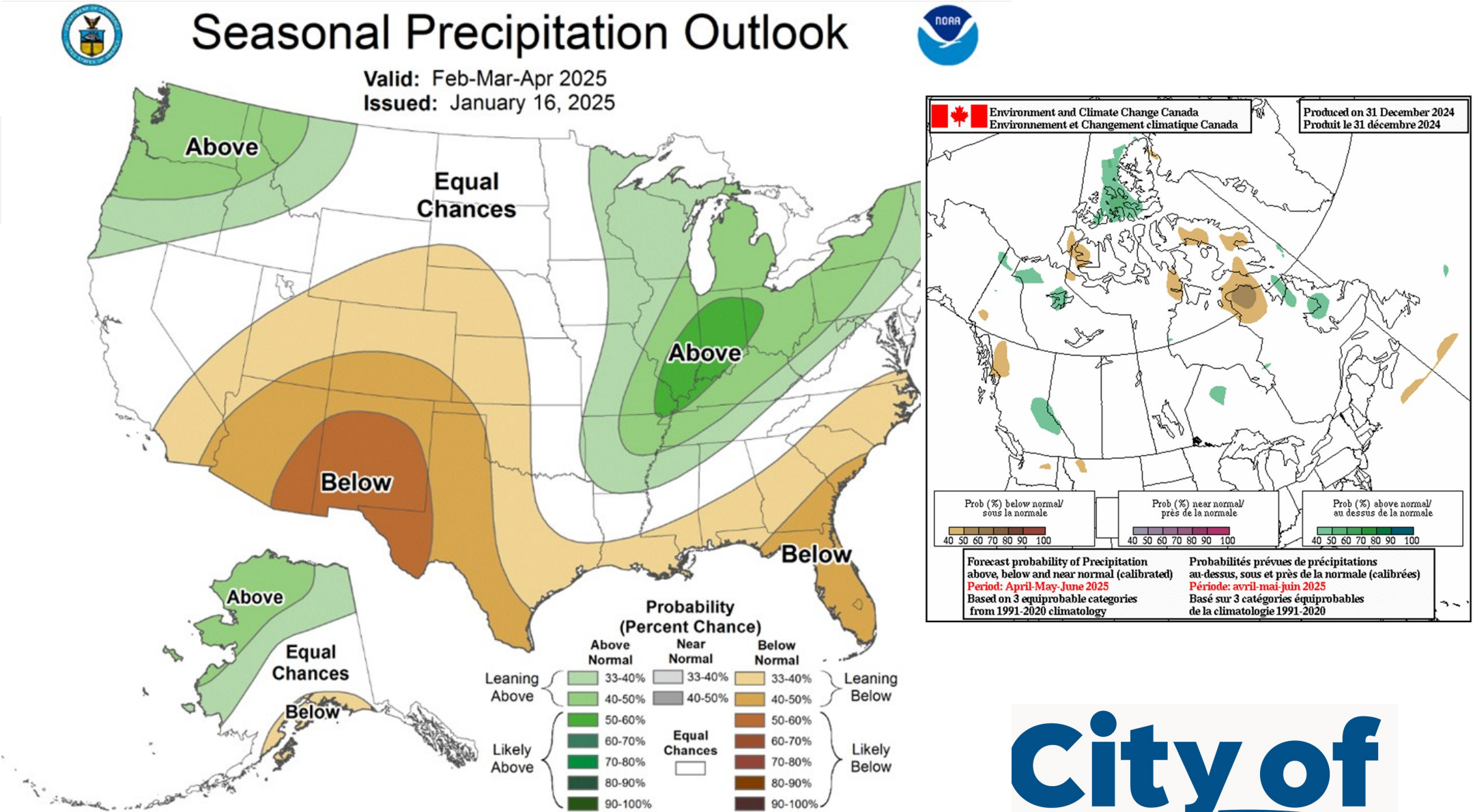


Flood Risk Factor 4

Long-Term

Precipitation Forecast

The National Weather Service and Environment and Climate Change Canada have issued their respective long-term (three month) forecast for March through May. Each forecast indicates an approximately Equal chance that watershed will receive normal precipitation through May. This forecast indicates moderate risk for precipitation events that could generate runoff. With soil conditions that are below normal there should be no concern for a Spring event.



There are four factors to consider when assessing the risk of spring flooding. Those factors are soil condition, snowpack, reservoir levels, and the long-term precipitation forecast
