THE CITY OF MINOT ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT (NO. 2)

The City is making adjustments to the Action Plan for the second allocation. Since the reimbursement activity is complete, left-over monies have been removed from the reimbursement activity and added to project delivery acquire additional properties. These monies will be used to cover attorney fees, closing costs, title searches, title insurance, etc., for the acquisition of additional properties. In addition, both street projects came in under the bid estimates leaving monies which are being moved into a new street activity which will serve an affordable housing development and a trailer park that was used by FEMA after the floods. Please note demolition costs will be adjusted when they are bid.

Comment Period

Citizen participation is an essential component of the Citywide planning effort. The City of Minot strongly encourages public participation in identifying needs and the use of CDBG Disaster Recovery Funding. Citizens and other interested parties are invited to comment on Amendment 2.
